Final Statement of Reasons

Subject Matter of Proposed Regulation: Intern Pharmacist Address

Title 16 Sections Affected: 1727.1

Updated Information

The Initial Statement of Reasons is included in this rulemaking file. The information contained therein accurately reflects the board's position regarding the posting of intern pharmacists' addresses on the Internet.

While the regulation prohibits the board from making addresses of record of intern pharmacists publicly available on the Internet, the board confirms that it will fully comply with the Public Records Act in connection with written requests to the board for intern pharmacists' addresses or record.

The board corrected one typographical omission and added the word "the" in final compilation of this rulemaking file. Specifically, the language now reads, "The board shall not make an intern pharmacist's address publicly available on the "Internet," ..."

Pursuant to review by the Office of Administrative Law, the board has revised the authority and reference citations in the final regulation text (Final Order of Adoption).

Summary of Comments Received During the 45-Day Comment Period:

No comments were received during the 45-day comment period.. No public comment hearing was requested in connection with this rulemaking and none was held.
