### Recent news:

- The Board met July 29-30 via teleconference and heard reports from committee meetings held July 8-9 and other items of business. [Action items](#) are posted on the [meetings page](#).

- The Board has released a Notice of Proposed Action to add section 1717.5 to Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations related to automatic refill programs. The comment period for the proposed action ends August 31, 2020. Information is on the [Pending Regulations](#) page.
- The Board has approved a Pharmacy Law waiver related to the [staffing ratio of pharmacists to intern pharmacists and general supervision for immunizations](#).
