23	(Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by		
24	Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Katelyn E. Docherty, Deputy Attorney		
25	General.		
26	2. Denise Mendoza Zamora (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by attorney		
27	Leah Alvarez, whose address is: 220 S. Mooney Blvd, Suite D, Visalia Ca, 93291.		
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3. On or about February 7, 2020, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 175789 to Denise Mendoza Zamora (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 7165 and expired on September 30, 2021, and has not been renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 7165 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on September 23, 2021. Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 7165 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7165. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 7165, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 175789 for the Board's formal acceptance.

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9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of her Pharmacy Technician Registration without further process.

CONTINGENCY

- 10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or her counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 11. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
- 13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

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JURISDICTION 1 2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the 3 Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated. 4 4. Section 4300 of the Code states, in pertinent part: 5 6 (a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked. 7 (b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found 8 guilty, by any of the following methods: 9 (1) Suspending judgment. 10 (2) Placing him or her upon probation. 11 (3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year. 12 (4) Revoking his or her license. 13 (5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in its discretion may deem proper. 14 15 (e) The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the 16 Government Code, and the board shall have all the powers granted therein. The action shall be final, except that the propriety of the action is subject to review by the 17 superior court pursuant to Section 1094.5 of the Code of Civil Procedure. 18 Section 4300.1 of the Code states: 5. 19 The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license 20 by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a 21 licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render 22 a decision suspending or revoking the license. 23 STATUTORY PROVISIONS 24 Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part: 6. 25 The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of 26 unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. 12	7. Section 4022 of the Code states:			
13	Dangerous drug or dangerous device means any drug or device unsafe for self-use in humans or animals, and includes the following:			
14 15	(a) Any drug that bears the legend: Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription, Rx only, or words of similar import.			
16	(b) Any device that bears the statement: Caution: federal law restricts this			
17	device to sale by or on the order of a, Rx only, or words of similar import, the blank to be filled in with the designation of the practitioner licensed to use or order use of the device.

19	(c) Any other drug or device that by federal or state law can be lawfully dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to Section 4006.			
20	8. Section 4059, subdivision (a), of the Code states:			
21	(a) A person may not furnish any dangerous drug, except upon the prescription			
22	of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7. A person may not furnish any dangerous device, except			
23	upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7.			
24	9. Section 4060 of the Code states:			
25	No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a			
26	person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, or a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to either subparagraph (D) of paragraph (4) of, or clause (iv) of			
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subparagraph (A) of paragraph (5) of, subdivision (a) of Section 4052. This section shall not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, when in stock in containers correctly labeled with the name and address of the supplier or producer.

Nothing in this section authorizes a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own stock of dangerous drugs and devices.

HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE PROVISIONS

10. Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a), states:

No person shall obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact.

11. Health and Safety Code section 11350, subdivision (a), states:

Except as otherwise provided in this division, every person who possesses (1) any controlled substance specified in subdivision (b), (c), (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, or specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in subdivision (h) of Section 11056, or (2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than one year, except that such person shall instead be punished pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code if that person has one or more prior convictions for an offense specified in clause (iv) of subparagraph (C) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of Section 667 of the Penal Code or for an offense requiring registration pursuant to subdivision (c) of Section 290 of the Penal Code.

12. Health and Safety Code section 11351 states:

Except as otherwise provided in this division, every person who possesses for sale or purchases for purposes of sale (1) any controlled substance specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, or specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in subdivision (h) of Section 11056, or (2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a narcotic drug, shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for two, three, or four years.

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COST RECOVERY

13. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

DRUG DESCRIPTIONS

- 14. Alprazolam is the generic name of the drug Xanax and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022 and a controlled substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d). Alprazolam is indicated for use for the treatment of anxiety.
- Promethazine with codeine is the generic name for Phenergan with codeine and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022 and a controlled substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11058, subdivision (c). Promethazine with codeine is indicated for use for the treatment of a cough.
- 16. Sertraline is the generic name for Zoloft and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022. Sertraline is indicated for use for the treatment of depression.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- In and between April 1, 2020 and March 1, 2021, Respondent worked for Rite Aid Pharmacy No. 6459 in Visalia, California (hereinafter Rite Aid), as a pharmacy technician.
- 18. On or about March 12, 2020, Rite Aid notified the Board that it had suffered a theft of controlled substances by an employee as well as suffered a robbery.
- On or about February 16, 2021, Rite Aid asset protection interviewed Respondent, and she admitted to diverting alprazolam, promethazine with codeine, and Zoloft.
- 20. On or about February 16, 2021, Respondent wrote a statement admitting to diverting alprazolam, promethazine with codeine, and Zoloft. Respondent admitted that she diverted the drugs at the request of a friend who offered to give her money for stealing alprazolam and promethazine with codeine for him. Respondent admitted to diverting two Zoloft tablets for her own personal use.

- 21. On or about February 16, 2021, Respondent reviewed a drug utilization review ("DUR") for the date range May 3, 2020 through January 11, 2021, and initialed next to all the medications she diverted. Respondent diverted over 1000 alprazolam tablets, and over \$140.00 worth of promethazine with codeine syrup.
- 22. On or about April 28, 2021, a Board of Pharmacy Investigator contacted Respondent via phone and requested that Respondent provide a written statement regarding the allegations set forth in paragraphs 17-21, above. Respondent failed to provide the Board with the requested statement.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Acts Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit, or Corruption)

23. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct pursuant to Code section 4301, subdivision (f), in that Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption. The circumstances are that Respondent diverted controlled substances and dangerous drugs from the Rite Aid pharmacy where she was employed, as set forth in paragraphs 17-21, above.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of Laws Regulating Controlled Substances)

- 24. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct pursuant to Code section 4301, subdivision (j), in that Respondent violated laws regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs. The circumstances are as follows:
- a. Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a), when she obtained controlled substances by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or subterfuge from the Rite Aid pharmacy where she was employed, as set forth in paragraphs 17-21, above.
- b. Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11350, subdivision (a), by possessing a controlled substance specified in paragraph (b), of Health and Safety Code section 11057, alprazolam, without having a valid prescription for alprazolam at the time as set forth in paragraphs 17-21, above.
