Waiver Related to Delivery Provisions of Business and Professions Code (BPC) Section 4059.5(a) & (d)

In light of the Governor's <u>proclamation</u> of a state of emergency in response to the Palisades Fire and consistent with BPC section 4062, Seung Oh, President of the California State Board of Pharmacy, through delegated authority, has authorized the following waiver of the above-referenced provisions of Pharmacy Law.

A manufacturer, wholesaler, or third-party logistics provider may directly, or through a carrier, deliver dangerous drugs or dangerous devices to an alternate premises under the following conditions.

- 1. The authorized purchaser is located in Los Angeles County or a surrounding county.
- Confirmation is received from the authorized purchaser that the intended recipient is legally authorized to receive the dangerous drug or dangerous device.
- 3. Confirmation is received from the authorized purchaser that the alternate premises identified has adequate security to secure the dangerous drug or dangerous device for up to 72 hours.
- 4. Delivery under this waiver may only occur upon signature of an authorized individual who shall sign for and receive the delivery.
- 5. Records of delivery documenting compliance with this waiver shall be maintained for a period of three years in a readily retrievable form.
