**Subject: Executive Officer Report**

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**a. Licensing Statistics**

On a quarterly basis, the Licensing Committee and Board review licensing statistics and processing times. As the Licensing Committee did not meet this quarter, and to ensure the Board remains apprised of processing times and workload, provided below is summary information including processing times and licensing statistics for the first six months of FY 2024/25 (July 1, 2024 – December 31, 2024). The detailed licensing statistics are provided in **Attachment 1**.

During the timeframe, the Board has received 7,661 initial applications, including:

- 1,056 intern pharmacists
- 1,087 pharmacist exam applications (345 new, 742 retake)
- 78 advanced practice pharmacists
- 2,912 pharmacy technicians
- 583 community pharmacy license applications (343 chain, 240 nonchain)
- 49 sterile compounding pharmacy license applications (39 LSC, 10 NSC, 0 SCP)
- 76 nonresident pharmacy license applications
- 6 hospital pharmacy license applications

During the timeframe, the Board has received 5 requests for temporary individual applications (Military Spouses/Partners), including:

- 5 temporary pharmacy technicians

During the timeframe, the Board has received 724 requests for temporary site license applications, including:

- 560 community pharmacy license applications
- 40 sterile compounding pharmacy license applications
- 56 nonresident pharmacy license applications
- 6 hospital pharmacy license applications

During the timeframe, the Board has issued 5,546 individual licenses, including:

- 1,049 intern pharmacists
- 1,080 pharmacists
- 61 advanced practice pharmacists

- 3,099 pharmacy technicians

During the timeframe, the Board has issued 4 temporary individual applications (Military Spouses/Partners), including:

- 4 temporary pharmacy technicians

During the timeframe, the Board has issued 305 site licenses without temporary license requests, including:

- 68 automated drug delivery systems (68 AUD, 0 APD)
- 37 community pharmacies
- 1 hospital pharmacy

During the timeframe, the Board has issued 601 temporary site licenses, including:

- 494 community pharmacies
- 13 hospital pharmacies

**b. Enforcement Statistics**

On a quarterly basis, the Enforcement and Compounding Committee and Board review enforcement statistics and investigation processing times. As the Enforcement and Compounding Committee did not meet this quarter, and to ensure the Board remains apprised, provided below is summary information including investigation benchmarks and enforcement statistics for the first six months of FY 2024/25 (July 1, 2024 – December 31, 2024). The detailed enforcement statistics are provided in **Attachment 2**.

During the first six months of the new fiscal year, July 2024 - December 2024, the Board initiated 1,531 complaints and closed 1,494 investigations. The Board has issued 79 letters of admonishment and 349 citations and referred 81 cases to the Office of the Attorney General. The Board has revoked 45 licenses, accepted the disciplinary surrender of 19 licenses, formally denied 3 applications, and imposed other levels of discipline against 61 licensees and/or applicants.

As of January 1, 2025, the Board had 1,347 field investigations pending. Following is a breakdown providing more detail in the various investigation processes:

**c. Biannual Report of the California Practice Standards and Jurisprudence Examination for Pharmacists (CPJE) and the North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination (NAPLEX)**

Generally, twice a year the Board publishes a report on the pass rates for the CPJE and NAPLEX exams. While this information is typically reported at the fall Board meeting, there was a delay in completing this data while finalizing the Board’s Sunset Report.

**Attachment 3** includes the aggregate information for examinations administered between April 1, 2024, and September 30, 2024, inclusive.

CPJE: The overall pass rate during the period was 66.4%. California schools generally had higher pass rates, with graduates from California outperforming other US candidates. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase in the pass rates for graduates from California schools, graduates from other US schools, and foreign graduates.

NAPLEX: The Board’s display of NAPLEX scores reflects scores associated with any candidate that took the CPJE during the time period with a score reported to the Board, regardless of when the NAPLEX was taken. The overall pass rate for this exam period was 80.2%. California schools had a lower pass rate of 77.3% compared with other US candidates having a pass rate of 86.3%.

**d. Sunset Oversight Update**

On January 6, 2025, the Board's Sunset Report was submitted. Following submission, the final report was posted on the Board's website - - [volume 1](#) and [volume 2](#). President Oh provided a cover letter to the report which is included in **Attachment 4**.

Although official details are not available, it is anticipated that the Board's oversight hearing will be conducted in the coming months. Following the hearing, the Board will have 30 days to provide its official response to issues raised by the oversight committee. Depending on the timing of the oversight hearing, an additional Board meeting may be required to approve draft responses.

**e. Online Renewal Payments**

Although online renewal processes have been available for a number of the Board's licensing categories, last year, the Board began its transition to renewal postcards with the link to the Board's online renewal system, in lieu of renewal applications, for many of its individual license types. This approach is consistent with several programs within DCA. The Board has used its subscriber alert system as the primary communication vehicle for licensees about the change. In September 2024, a banner was added to the top of the Board's homepage to make it easily accessible for licensees and an article was written about the renewal process in the December 2024 issue of *The Script*.

Although the transition has not been without some challenges, in Quarter 2 of the Fiscal Year (October 1 – December 31, 2024), 53.5% of pharmacists and pharmacy technicians renewed their licenses online.

Board staff continue to work with DCA on some challenges stemming from a transition to a new payment vendor.

**f. PIC Webinar**

On December 23, 2024, the Office of Administrative Law [approved](#) the Board's proposed changes to Title 16, California Code of Regulations (CCR) section 1709.1. As approved, the regulations require a pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) to complete the Board-provided training course and an attestation prior to approval and appointment as a PIC. The regulation becomes effective April 1, 2025.

Following approval, Board staff are finalizing the online training program and updating the Change of Pharmacist-in-Charge application and pharmacy applications to include the attestation. It is anticipated the online training program will be available in early February with the updated application forms ready for release in mid-March to coincide with the effective date of the regulation. The training will be available on the Board's new learning management system. Individuals will be required to create an account to complete the training. Further, at the end of the training, individuals will be awarded one hour of CE for completing the training.

**g. Executive Order Related to Fees For Licensees Impacted by Los Angeles Area Fires**

On January 29, Governor Newsom issued an [executive order](#) that extends the deadline to pay fees to renew a license, for a period of one year, for any licensee with an expiration date occurring between January 1, 2025, and July 1, 2025, whose business or residence is in certain specified zip codes. The order also suspends fees that would ordinarily be required for licensees seeking a duplicate or replacement license, and provides that replacement licenses shall be provided to impacted licensees free of charge until January 7, 2026. Further, the order suspends delinquency, late, or penalty fees for the renewal of a license for impacted licensees until July 1, 2025.

Board staff are working with the department on implementation. It is important to note that renewal fees are not being waived; rather, deferral of the payment is allowed for up to one year. Additional information will be provided during the meeting if available.

**h. Medication Error Reporting**

Relevant Law: Business and Professions Code Section 4113.1 establishes requirements for a community pharmacy to report, either directly or through a designated third party, medications errors to an entity approved by the Board.

Background: As part of its implementation activities related to Assembly Bill 1286 (Haney, Chapter 470, Statutes of 2023) the Board was required to approve an entity to receive and review medication error reports consistent with the provisions of law. Following the state contracting process, as part of the Board's September 12, 2024 meeting, the Board approved ISMP as the entity to receive and review the reports.

Recent Update: On January 30, 2025, the contract was signed and approved. In the coming weeks staff will be implementing activities with ISMP. Additional updates will be provided as information is available. The Board will send notice to licensees informing them of their legal responsibility under BPC 4113.1 and that ISMP is the named vendor for collecting reports and billing.

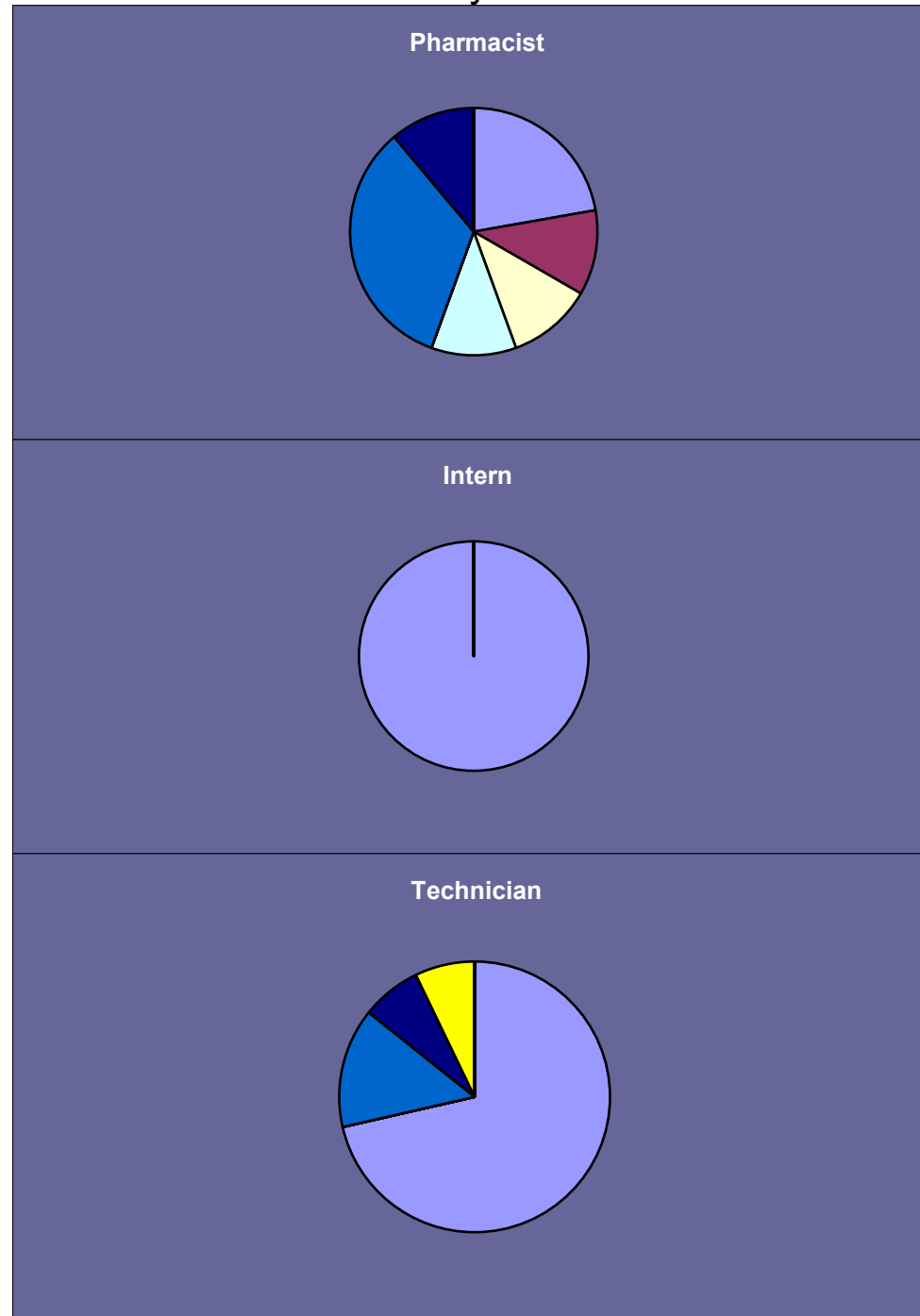

On behalf of the California State Board of Pharmacy, it is my honor to present to your committees the California State Board of Pharmacy's Sunset Review Report. This report highlights the Board's activities and achievements during the past four years and responds to issues raised during the previous Sunset Review.

As a consumer protection agency charged with protecting and promoting the health and safety of Californians through effective oversight of the pharmacy profession. The Board understands that consumer protection embodies a number of different activities including communication and education, policy making, licensing activities as well as enforcement related activities.

One of the most consequential efforts undertaken by the Board during the reporting period was developing, sponsoring and securing passage of Assembly Bill 1286 (Haney, Chapter 470, Statutes of 2023) focusing on addressing known causes of medication errors while also establishing first in the nation mandatory reporting of medication errors in the outpatient setting. This landmark legislation also establishes minimum staffing levels in chain community pharmacies and strengthens the requirements for surgical clinics. The Board is extremely grateful for the Legislature's support of this measure.

As detailed in the Board's report, the Board continues to identify opportunities to promote consumer protection. Included in its report the Board has identified several new issues, some of which could fundamentally change the regulation of the practice of pharmacist and improve access to pharmacist care and improve the health of Californians.

We appreciate the opportunity to work with the Legislature, the Administration and interested stakeholders to review the Board's activities during the past four years and to discuss the Board's priorities and plans for future policy changes to protect and promote the health and safety of California consumers.
